The Firm: Competitors describe the IP team here as "one of the most feared in the courtroom." It manages to achieve an "unparalleled level of cooperation" and sustain an "unrivaled work ethic" that clients find deeply appealing. The firm's dedicated IP litigators have contributed much to its profile by dealing with top clients on patent, trade secrets and copyright cases. Market sources stated that the

combination of an "excellent reputation" and "unwavering efforts to operate cost-efficiently" guarantees Keker & Van Nest its position in the top tier. The tenacious Jeffrey Chanin has worked on several patent infringement and trade secrets misappropriation cases. Recent successes include obtaining a substantial settlement for Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing. His colleague Jon Streeter is another IP litigator renowned for being "hard-hitting and talented."
